

Flavoring compounds have been tied to a serious illness known as 'popcorn lung'

TUESDAY, Dec. 8, 2015 (HealthDay News) -- Many [electronic cigarettes](#) contain flavoring chemicals that may cause [lung disease](#), researchers say. One such flavoring chemical, acetoin, was detected in 46 of the flavors while another, called 2,3-pentanedione, was found in 23 of the flavors, the findings showed. There are currently more than 7,000 varieties of flavored e-cigarettes and liquid, the researchers said, but there's a lack of information on their potential health effects.
